**Background:** (broadly): Social entrepreneurs = {PASSION and EXPERIENCE} **but** [NO time or expertise]

Students = {TIME and EXPERTISE} **but** [NO passion or experience]

Chat with Cardiff Met about pan-Wales version.

Menter Iontach Nua is a learning, networking and support initiative designed to improve the innovation, creativity and entrepreneurial skills of social enterprises and has two primary dimensions:  
(1) A Masters degree in Management (Innovation in Social Enterprise)  
(2) A suite of networking, training, mentoring and other support  
**Our vision:** Masters Students working in the MIN programme will act as shepherds and, as part of their masters training (thesis?), they will supervise, guide, consult, and "use" students in the SEA.

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## Lessons Learned

- Serious appetite from all parties for MORE
- The community responded robustly
  - SE: "First time uni ever done anything"
  - Council: "Finally, a way-in to the university!"
- Many students now intend to go work for Ses
- Interest is appearing from all sides (business, gov't, education)
- Numerous funding opportunities
- Need more "follow through" mechanisms (MIN?)
